



Hi everyone. I hope you all enjoyed the extra long weekend last week. With only 6 weeks to go until the end of the school year, we are busy preparing for next year. Our Prep Transition program commenced 2 weeks ago with a Parent Information evening. We are excited to meet our new 2018 Preps on Tuesday as they participate in their first of four transition sessions.

We have begun planning our grade structure for 2018 based on our proposed enrolment numbers. As it is vital for these numbers to be correct, **if your child is NOT attending our school next year (grade 6 students excluded) and you have not notified us of the move, please let our office staff know as soon as possible. Also, if you have a child starting Prep next year and have not yet enrolled them at our school, please do this by Tuesday 14th November** so that they do not miss out on Prep Transition. If you know of any friends, family or neighbours who have not yet enrolled their pre-school child please inform them that they need to do this now.



The Grade 2 Sleepover was a great success. I would like to thank all the staff who assisted on the night, in particular those who gave up a night with their own families to supervise our students and give them their first camping experience.

Our students and staff thoroughly enjoyed the Fun Run last Friday, demonstrating their fitness by running laps of the oval. Thank you to the families who have donated money. STUDENT WELLBEING NEWS



Roxburgh Rise is excited to be participating in the Glasses for Kids Program. This program is providing free vision screening, further eye testing and free glasses, if required, for all Prep to Year 3 students.

All children, regardless of their background or circumstances, should have access to high-quality services and the supports they

need to thrive. Children with uncorrected vision deficiencies can experience difficulty in learning, which can lead to behavioural challenges in the classroom. Identifying and addressing vision problems early ensures students don't fall behind. Children with vision deficiencies often do not report symptoms, assuming that everyone sees the world in the same way as they do. Screening, testing, and the provision of glasses is backed by evidence as an effective means of supporting students and their families, by helping to improve learning behaviours and leading to better schooling outcomes.

The Glasses for Kids program will give an individual vision screening to students at school. Children who require additional eye testing will either be tested onsite at the school or they will be provided with a voucher and directed to an established optometry practice for further bulk billed testing. **Glasses will be dispensed for free, if needed.**

The vision screening will be conducted at school by registered optometrists and trained optical staff from OneSight. The scheduled date for screening at our school is **Monday the 12th of February 2018**. Parental consent will be required for students to participate in the program. Participation is voluntary.

An information sheet for parents which outlines key details about the program will be sent home with all Prep to Year 3 students at the start of 2018. A consent form and a brief eye health questionnaire will also be sent home and these should be returned to school, completed and signed, to enable participation in the program.

No appointment or referral is required; however, you may be required to wait, or asked to attend another clinic date.

When you arrive, a 20-30 minute time slot will be allocated to you.

A Speech Pathologist will talk to you about ways to help your child's communication, and may refer you to another service.
